LAKEHEAD UNIVERSITY: An application has been made to the Government to establish a new law school in Thunder Bay. Its focus is to educate students to provide legal services to Aboriginal Committees and others in Northwest Ontario and elsewhere in the province. The Law Society must first approve the program before graduates may participate in the Bar Admission licensing process.
